

West Koshkonong compared with Hadsel in Vesterålen, 1824, and Grytten in Romsdal, 1828
















Valders Church, Manitowoc County, WI, 1853–54 (left) Compared with Dverberg Church in Norway, 1841–43 (right)

Present stone church from 1877. Painting ca 1935




