REPORT

ANNUAL MEETING and SEMINAR FINNSKOGEN, NORWAY 2010

The national committees of Norway, Sweden and Finland invited all CIAV members to the annual meeting and seminar to be held in Kongsvinger, Norway 31^{st} May -4^{th} June 2010 with emails sent in September 2009.

The response from ICOMOS members and cultural workers was good and the necessary financial support was received.

Program

The theme for the seminar was "Vernacular Crossing Borders" The venue was Finnskogen, an area straddling the border between Norway and Sweden, where generations of Finnish immigrants have lived on the fringe of the existing native society and developed their own vernacular heritage based on traditions from their homeland.

This Finnish immigrant community offers unique opportunities for the study of the assimilation of a foreign minority culture into an established society - the survival of national identity in the face of an adopted environment. Their history, way of life and the question of future conservation was issues for in-depth discussion throughout the conference.

There were 18 papers presented from Finland, Sweden, Norway, Estonia, Russia, Greece, Egypt, Canada, Mexico and Australia.
