To the State Parties of Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland and Estonia.

Concerning new nominations to the World Heritage List of the Nordic and Baltic region.

The meeting of the Nordic ICOMOS National Committees in Tallinn, Estonia, on 20 February 2010 proposes an initiative to study the potential of transboundary nominations of shared heritage for inclusion on the tentative lists of the countries represented.

There is a need for comparative studies on common Nordic themes to select topics and appropriate areas for inclusion in future nominations, following the example set by the first nominations from the Nordic countries to the World Heritage List.

Appropriate themes could be:

- findings of the trading, sites and routes of the Vikings
- Sami sites and culture
- soft wood construction and
- Hanseatic trading settlements and routes
- industrial sites
- migrant settlements.

The ICOMOS committees are willing to take part in this programme once funding has been made available. The Nordic group and the individual national committees also offer advice and assistance to developing countries during the WH nomination process.
